## GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

The south half of this township is mostly mountainous and rolling hills. The north half is rolling land cut by numerous washes and small drains which find an outlet

numerous washes and small drains which find an outlet near the NW. cor. of the township.

This township can be entered by any one of several roads which lead into the interior. Cushman Wells is located near the SW. cor. of sec. 4. This is the only watering place in this area. At this point there is a windmill, a sheep watering trough and a house. It has been used at different times as a camp ground. This area is used for grazing purposes; a large part of it is very poor for grazing but some of it is fair.

The principal undergrowth found here is shadscale and rabbit brush. Most of the lower north part of the township has some scattering sand grass which serves as exel-

ship has some scattering sand grass which serves as exellant grazing for cattle and sheep where ever it is found in sufficient quantities. There is no timber within this area. No indications of mineralization were noted.
