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GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The entire area within this township is generally one of rolling sandhills and gentle rolling mountains. The undergrowth varies from medium dense to scattered and is chiefly shadscale, greasewood, scrub big sage, mountain rush and some sand grass. Grazing over the entire area would be classed as poor, although it is fair to good in a few isolated spots. There are also some spots which are covered with fine drifted sand which is completely barren of all vegetation.

There are two little used dirt roads that enter the township on the South boundary and traverse it for three or four miles North easterly. Aside from these there is no other way to get into this area conveniently. In the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 29 there is a surface well and the remains of a dugout dwelling that was evidently used many years past. At the present there are no inhabitants within this area.

No evidence of mineralization was noted.

The magnetic declination was not recorded due to a sluggish and inaccurate needle.
