General Description

The area covered by the foregoing survey is generally rough and mountainous in character, and lies on the west and southwest slopes of the Spring Mountains, near the western boundary of Clark County, Nevada.

Soil over the area is generally poor, shallow and rocky or gravelly.

Timber consists mainly of juniper and pinon, with some mahogany and an occasional joshua tree. Undergrowth is mainly sagebrush, blackbrush and bitterbrush. Grazing conditions over the area range from fair to poor.

Although there has been some mineral prospecting and there is an occasional prospect hole, there are no developed mineral deposits and no patented mining claims within the area covered by this survey.

An unimproved road, which is little more than a trail, crosses the area from the west boundary of section 30 on the west boundary to the north boundary of section 5 on the north boundary of the township.
