- Chains  
63.00 Ravine, course S. 60° E.; asc. abruptly over series of outcroppings, crags and ledges 550 ft.
- 68.00 Sharp point of spur, projects S. 60° E.; desc. 300 ft.
- 73.00 Ravine, course S. 50° E.; asc. 520 ft. over crags and series of ledges.
- 80.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 1 and 12, with brass cap mkd.

A mahogany, 5 ins. diam., bears N. 42° W., 74 lks. dist., mkd. T11N R58E S1 BT.

A mahogany, 4 ins. diam., bears S. 79½° W., 66 lks. dist., mkd. T11N R58E S12 BT.

Land, extremely rough rugged and high mountainous.  
Soil, light sandy, very shallow, with many limestone porphyry, shale and quartzite outcroppings and ledges; 4th rate.  
Timber, pinon pine, juniper, mahogany and fir; undergrowth, sagebrush, laurel, servicebrush and a fair growth of grass.  
Grazing, good.

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North, along the E. bdy. of sec. 1.

Over mountainous land, along a general SE. slope, through dense timber and undergrowth; asc. 90 ft.

- 8.70 Top of spur, projects E.; desc. 25 ft. along broken E. slope.
- 11.90 Asc. 100 ft.
- 15.00 Top of spur, projects E. for about 20.00 chains; thence projects SE.; desc. abruptly over series of crags, small ledges and outcroppings, 545 ft.
- 30.90 Ravine, course N. 70° E.; asc. 80 ft.
- 40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 22 ins. in the ground to bedrock and in a mound of stone to top, for ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 1, with brass cap mkd.

A pinon pine, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 21¼° W., 58 lks. dist., mkd. ¼ S1 BT.

Asc. 320 ft. over rocky S. slope.

- 49.30 Top of spur, projects E.; desc. 225 ft. over a densely wooded N. slope, balsam fir predominating.
- 55.80 Head of ravine, course E.; asc. 50 ft.
- Enter dense mahogany, interspersed with fir and pinon pine.
