## General Description

The area covered by the present survey in T. 11 N., R. 58 E. is generally rough and broken and mountainous in character. The area lies along the middle to lower slopes on the southwest side of the White Pine Mountains section of the Nevada National Forest, with general drainage to the southwest towards Currant Creek.

The soil over the area is generally poor, shallow and gravelly or rocky.

Timber consists chiefly of juniper and pinon, and generally quite scattering, and many of the south slopes are entirely devoid of timber. Undergrowth consists mainly of sagebrush, but in places there is considerable bitterbrush, shadscale and greasewood.

Grazing conditions over the area vary from fair to poor, however the chief use of the area is for grazing purposes.
