## General Description

This township lies about 12 to 20 miles northeast of Ely, Nevada on the western slopes of the Shell Creek Range, and the present resurvey delineates the dividing line between lands administered by the Bureau of Land Management on the west and the Forest Service on the east. The Forest boundary follows along the north-south center lines of sections 4, 9, 16 and 21, the west-half of line between sections 21 and 28, and between sections 28-29 and 32-33.

The land is rolling to broken mountainous, with drainage to the west and northwest. The soil is generally shallow sand and gravel to barren rock.

Timber consists of pinon and juniper on the lower slopes with commercial pine on the higher slopes. Undergrowth consists mainly of sagebrush and rabbit brush, with some scrub oak and mahogany.

The land is chiefly valuable for stock grazing.
