

## Dependent Resurvey, Portion of the Subdivision of T. 28 N., R. 58 E.

## Chains

Note: The north boundary of the township was retraced for 68.00 chains to the east and 20.00 chains to the west from this point and diligent search made at record distances for corners, but no trace was found of the original survey. The corner of sections 4, 5, 32 and 33 is therefore reestablished at proportionate measurement between nearest original corners to the north and south of it.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

Raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high, W. of cor.

From this corner

The E. edge of gravel surfaced county road, bears West, 10 lks. dist.; road bears N.  $15^{\circ}$  E. and S.  $15^{\circ}$  E.

Cor. of wire fences, bears S.  $70^{\circ} 04'$  E., 353 lks. dist. Direction of fences from fence corner not recorded.

Another cor. of wire fence bears S.  $38^{\circ} 35'$  E.,  $158\frac{1}{2}$  lks. dist. Direction of fences from fence corner not recorded.

Another cor. of wire fence, bears S.  $30^{\circ}$  W., 349 lks. dist. Direction of fences from fence corner not recorded.

The highest visible point of a peak, bears N.  $70^{\circ} 38'$  W.

The original cor. of secs. 28, 29, 32 and 33, T. 29 N., R. 58 E., bears N.  $0^{\circ} 37'$  E., 80.52 chs. dist., monumented with a granite stone, 10x10x7 ins. above the ground, firmly set, mkd. with 1 groove on S. and 4 grooves on E. faces, witnessed by a mound of stone, 2 ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high, W. of cor. This is the control cor. to N., for proportionate measurement for reestablishment of the cor. of secs. 4, 5, 32 and 33, Ts. 28 and 29 N., R. 58 E.

Land, rolling.

Soil, sandy clay loam, gravelly and rocky.

Timber, none; undergrowth, sagebrush, buck brush and a fair growth of grass.

#### General Description

The lines resurveyed in this township lie in Ruby Valley along or near the east foot of the Ruby Mountains.

The west shore of the north end of Ruby Lake cuts across sections 21, 29 and 32, and the west shore of the south end of the dry bed of Franklin Lake cuts across sections 4, 9, 10 and 15.

The land between the two lakes and between the lake shores and the east foot of the Ruby Mountains is generally overgrown with quite dense undergrowth, and with a good stand of grass forming good grazing land, and where cleared forms good hay meadow land.

The gravel surfaced Ruby Valley County road crosses the township in the north-south direction from section 5 on the north boundary to section 31 on the south boundary.
