

SUBDIVISION OF T. 31 N., R. 69 E.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The West half of this township is rolling mountainous land, with high hills in secs. 4 and 5. The East portion is rolling with level land along the East boundary.

There is no water in the township, but there are numerous washes and gulches, all of which are dry except for a short time during the spring runoff.

The timber is scattering pine and juniper, mostly in the West portion. The undergrowth is sagebrush, greasewood and rabbit brush with some bunch grass, quite dense through the greater part of the township. The grazing is generally poor. The soil is rocky and gravelly, and rocky clay; 4th. rate.

U. S. Highway No. 50, from Ely, Nevada to Wendover, Utah, traverses secs. 1, 12, 13, 23, 24, 26, and 35. There are several unimproved roads leading off from the highway, but not travelled to any extent.

No particular evidence of mineral was discovered, and there are no settlers residing in the township.
