

## SUBDIVISION OF T. 32 N., R. 69 E.

## Chains

79.94 The cor. of secs. 17, 18, 19 and 20.

Land, rolling.

Soil, rocky, sandy, alkaline clay, 3rd rate.

No timber; undergrowth, sagebrush and greasewood.

S. 89° 58' W., on a random line, bet. secs. 18 and 19.

40.00 Set temp.  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.

79.94 Intersect the W. bdy. of the Tp., 9 lks. S. of the cor. of secs. 13, 18, 19 and 24; an iron post, 2 ins. diam., 6 ins. above the ground, mkd. and witnessed, as described in the field notes of the survey of the E. bdy. of T.32N., R. 68 E.

Thence

S. 89° 58' E., on true line, bet. secs. 18 and 19.

Over broken mountainous land, thru scattering timber and undergrowth.

5.20 Road, bears N. and S.

9.90 Spur, slopes N. 70° E.; asc. 30 ft. over a NW. slope.

16.50 Spur, same, slopes S. 85° E.; desc. 130 ft. along a N. slope.

39.94 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., upon a cross X, on bed rock, and in a mound of stone to top, for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.

45.00 Foot of descent, bears NE. and SW.: leave scattering timber; asc. 30 ft. over a NW. slope.

51.00 Spur, (same as at 9.90 chs. and 16.50 chs.) slopes N. 60° E.; desc. 40 ft. over broken land.

75.00 Spur, slopes S.; desc. 50 ft. over an E. slope.

79.94 The cor. of secs. 17, 18, 19 and 20.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay, 3rd rate.

Timber, pine and juniper; undergrowth, sagebrush.

N. 0° 4' W., bet. secs. 17 and 18.
