Final Test of Solar Attachments.

October 28, 1938; at the suspension of this survey, the solar
attachments of the instruments used thereon, were tested upon
meridians established within the township, as hereinbefore detailed,
and found free from appreciable error.

General Description

Township 31 north, range 68 east is situated about 12 miles
southwesterly from Wendover, Nevada; it cannot be reached by either
State or Federal highways. The land is mountainous, increasing in
unevenness westward.

The soil is a rocky, sandy clay, mixed with decomposed lime-
stone, in quality from a 2nd to 4th rate.

Scattering juniper, pinon pine, mahogany and sparse growth of
non-commercial cedar, white pine, and spruce, together with an
undergrowth of sagebrush, rabbitbrush, mountainrush and mountain
grasses are found within the township.

There is a good spring located in Lion Canyon, in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$
of sec. 16 and another spring is located in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 27.
No other water was located within the township.

This township is suitable for cattle grazing only.

There are no settlers within the township.
