## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

This township is located in Lake Valley and lies east of the Ely Range of mountains and west of the Wilson Creek Range. The general elevation of the township is approximately 6,000 ft. above sea level.

The southeastern and southwestern portion of the township is gently rolling land, and the remainder of the area is nearly level. The soil is a sandy and gravelly clay loam, but there is a small area in the northwest part of the township which is a sandy and volcanic ash loam. There are no flowing streams.

An oiled road, U.S. Highway No. 93, enters the township from the south near the standard ½ sec. cor. of sec. 31; traverses in a general northwest direction and leaves the township near the ½ sec. cor. of sec. 30, on the west boundary. A graded, graveled road, from Pony Springs to the Atlantic Mining District, enters the township from the southwest near the standard ½ sec. cor. of sec. 34, traverses in a general ENE. direction and leaves the township near the ½ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, on the east boundary.

There are no settlers in the township at the present time. A drilled well is located in the NE% of sec. 31. This well may have been drilled for irrigation purposes, as the land adjacent to the well has been cleared of undergrowth, but no ditches have been constructed and the land has not been tilled for seeding. A drilled well with a windmill and concrete tank is located in the SW% of sec. 35 and another in the SW% of sec. 5. The wells are being used to furnish water for livestock.

A portion of the southern part of secs. 32, 33, 34, 35 and 36 has been cleared of undergrowth and seeded to crested wheat grass to provide better range for livestock grazing. The remaining portion of the township is used for livestock grazing, but there are indications that there is a trend toward clearing the land of undergrowth to improve the stand of native grasses or to seed additional areas to grasses in order to provide better range for livestock.
