

Retracement of a Portion of the (1902) South Bdy. of T. 5 N., R. 67 E.

Chains

Land, rolling to broken.
Soil, sandy and gravelly.
Timber, juniper; undergrowth, sagebrush.

Discussion

The above retracement of the west half of the 1902 south boundary of T. 5 N., R. 67 E., and the concurrent retracement of the corresponding portion of the 1873 north boundary of T. 4 N., R. 67 E., as recorded in the field notes of that township, indicate the existence of a tract (or hiatus) of unsurveyed public land lying between these boundaries.

Retracement of the (1902) West Bdy. of T. 5 N., R. 67 E.

Retracement of the (1902) W. bdy. of T. 5 N., R. 67 E., as established by T. K. Stewart, Deputy Surveyor, in 1902; erroneously reported as a reestablishment of the line originally surveyed by Monroe and Bateman, Deputy Surveyors, in 1873.

From the (1902) cor. of Tps. 4 and 5 N., Rs. 66 and 67 E.

N. 0° 13' W., bet. secs. 31 and 36.

N. 0° 06' W., bet. secs. 25 and 30.

40.11 The original (1902) $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 25 and 30, monumented with a stone, set, mkd. and witnessed, as described in the official record.

N. 0° 02' W., beginning new measurement.

40.04 The original (1902) cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25, and 30, monumented with a stone, set, mkd. and witnessed, as described in the official record.

N. 0° 34' W., bet. secs. 19 and 24.

40.03 The original (1902) $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 19 and 24, monumented with a stone, set, mkd. and witnessed, as described in the official record.
