GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land encompassed by the boundaries of this portion of T. 29 N., R. 53 E., is mountainous, with the general drainage southeastward, carried by intermittently flowing water in many creeks and draws. The soil is a rocky clay, 3rd rate and supports a good growth of mountain grass. There is a sparse growth of aspen and mountain mahogany, with a scattering growth of sagebrush and buckbrush. Grazing can be carried on successfully. There are no settlers.
