

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land encompassed by the boundaries of this portion of T. 29 N., R. 53 E., is mountainous, with the general drainage south-eastward, carried by intermittently flowing water in many creeks and draws. The soil is a rocky clay, 3rd rate and supports a good growth of mountain grass. There is a sparse growth of aspen and mountain mahogany, with a scattering growth of sagebrush and buckbrush. Grazing can be carried on successfully. There are no settlers.
