GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The area within T. 46 N., R. 32 E. is rough and mountainous in character being located at the head of drainages into Bilk Creek, Wilder Creek and tributaries to Kings River, ranging in elevation from 5,000 to 8,000 ft. above sea level. The slopes are generally covered with volcanic stones. The soil is a fairly good sandy loam although very rocky and supports a good stand of sage brush and native grasses and weeds.

There are numerous springs at the head of the various drainages and a year around flow of water in Bilk Creek, providing a good supply of stock water.

There was no settlement within the township at the time of the survey, the land being used for stock grazing only.

There are groves of aspen in the draws at the head of creeks tributary to Kings River and at the head of Wilder Creek. Aspen, alder and willow line the banks of Bilk Creek.

There was evidence of a limited amount of prospecting activity in sec. 5. No other indications of mineral were observed within the township.

The area is very good grazing land although it indicates overgrazing in the past.
