GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The survey of Sections 1 to 10 and 15 to 19 inclusive was completed under the current subdivisional survey. The lands in these sections varies from gentle rolling semi-desert lands in sections 1 and 2 to rough, broken mountainous lands in sections 16 and 17. The soil varies from a fine sandy and gravelly loam of 2nd to 3rd rate in the rolling lands to a coarse rocky loam, 3rd and 4th rate on the high mountainous slopes; all slopes have a moderately heavy stand of undergrowth consisting principally of sagebrush, yellow top rabbit brush and on the lower slopes, shadscale and greasewood.

The only water in the township is Blue Wing Spring situated in the N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  of Sec. 22 of the previously surveyed area. This spring has been developed and has several watering troughs making the immediately surrounding country available for grazing. The higher slopes thruout the township afford good to very good grazing depending upon the availability of water for stock watering purposes.

No indications of mineral were noted.

The nearest postoffice and supply point is at Fernley, Nevada, about 40 miles distant in a southerly direction.

The mean magnetic declination was found to be 18° 30' E.
