Mean watch time of observation (watch is $\frac{1}{2}$ minute slow of 120° meridian standard time by radio signal) 4h 58.6m p.m.
 Mean horizontal angle from Polaris to flag 1° 21' 20"
 Azimuth of Polaris 1° 19' 00" E.
 True bearing of flag N. 0° 02.3' W.

SURVEY OF THE NORTH BOUNDARY OF T. 28 N., R. 26 E.

At the cor. of Ts. 28 and 29 N., R. 26 E., on the W. bdy. of the Tp., which is an iron post, 3 in. diam., firmly set, marked and witnessed as described in the field notes of T. 28 N., R. 25 E., surveyed under this group, in latitude 40° 20' N., and longitude 119° 07.5' W., I turn 90° from a line of flags on the W. bdy. of the Tp., and run

East, on a random line, making proper offsets to the north from the tangent to the parallel at intervals of 40.00 chs., setting temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. and sec. cors. along the line bet. Ts. 28 and 29 N., R. 26 E. At 479.54 chs., the parallel intersects the cor. of Ts. 28 and 29 N., Rs. 25 and 26 E., which is an iron post, 3 ins. diam., firmly set, marked and witnessed as described in the official record.

Thence

West, on true line, bet. secs. 1 and 36.

Asc. 320 ft. over an abrupt, rocky E. slope thru scattering low undergrowth.

11.70 Narrow rocky spur ridge, bears S. 20° E. and N. 20° W., desc. 540 ft. over precipitous W. slope, to $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

22.20 Dry wash, drains N. 65° W.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 30 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.
