SURVEY OF THE N. BDY. OF T. 28 N., R. 26 E.

Chains

Undergrowth, shadscale, rabbitbrush, sagebrush.
Grazing, fair to good.

SUBDIVISION OF T. 28 N., R. 26 E.

I commence the subdivisional survey of T. 28 N., R. 26 E., at the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36 on the S. bdy. of the Tp., which is an iron post, 2 ins. diam., firmly set, marked and witnessed as described in the field notes of T. 27 N., R. 26 E., surveyed under this group.

Thence

N. 0° 01' W., bet. secs. 35 and 36.

Over rough mountainous land thru dense undergrowth. Asc. 320 ft. over steep rocky S. slope.

12.20 Spur, slopes S. 50° E., continue along a steep E. slope.

19.70 Slope changes to abrupt NE., desc. 200 ft.

26.40 Spur, slopes N. 40° E., desc. 150 ft. over steep N. slope.

30.60 Ravine, drains N. 20° E., desc. 120 ft. along a broken E. slope.

39.00 End of rocky spur from the SW., desc. 30 ft. over N. slope to $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 30 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.

41.00 Draw, drains E., asc. 250 ft. over broken SE. and S. slopes.

53.80 Spur, slopes E., desc. 100 ft. over broken E. and NE. slopes.

65.60 Small spur, slopes E. from SW., desc. 170 ft. over abrupt N. slope.

71.20 Draw, drains N. 80° E., asc. 60 ft. over SE. slope.

74.60 Spur, slopes E., desc. 150 ft. over rocky N. slope.

80.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 25, 26, 35 and 36, with brass cap mkd.
