## INDEPENDENT RESURVEY OF NORTH BOUNDARY OF T. 20 S., R. 64 E.

Chains

raise a mound  
of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor.

Corner is 110 ft. below last spur.

Land, rolling desert; general drainage and exposure SE. on  
east 46 chs. and SW. on remainder of mile.

Soil, clay loam, rocky in places; 4th rate.

Timber, none.

Undergrowth, sage, creosote, and buck brush and scrub  
cactus.

Poor grazing land.

West, bet. secs. 6 and 31, on a transit line, describing  
the tangent, which bears S. 89° 56.9' W.

Over rolling desert land, through scattering undergrowth,  
descend a general SW. slope.

4.90 Wash, 30 lks. wide, 5 ft. deep, course S. 10° W.

13.50 Wide flat wash, course S. 10° W.

27.70 Wash, 60 lks. wide, 4 ft. deep, course S.

40.00 N. 22 lks. from the tangent,

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in  
the ground, with a limestone, 5x4x2 ins., marked X, de-

79.60 N. 26 lks. from the tangent, the cor. of Tps. 19 and 20 S.,  
Rs. 63 and 64 E., heretofore described.

Land, rolling desert; general drainage and exposure SW.  
Soil, clay loam and gypsum; 4th rate.

Timber, none.

Undergrowth, creosote, buck and sage brush, along with  
some scrub cactus and sand grass.

Poor grazing land.

From the point of intersection of the tangent with the W.  
boundary of the Tp., I sight east along the tangent and  
deflect an angle of 90° 03.8' to the right, to the line  
bet. secs. 1 and 6; I make four repetitions of this angle  
and the multiple angle reads 360° 15'.

## INDEPENDENT RESURVEY OF SUBDIVISION OF T. 20 S., R. 64 E.

Independent Resurvey superseding the survey executed  
by T.A. Magee, U. S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1882.

From the standard cor. of secs. 35 and 36, on the S. bdy.  
of T. 20 S., R. 64 E., which is an iron post, 2 ins. diam.,  
firmly set, with brass cap marked and witnessed as describ-  
ed in the official record; I sight East along the standard
