

## INDEPENDENT RESURVEY OF SUBDIVISION OF T. 20 S., R. 65 E.

## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 20 South, Range 65 East, is desert; very rough broken hills cover the greater portion of the township, being less rugged in parts of the extreme eastern, western, and northern portions. The general formation is limestone, with volcanic formation in the southern portion, conglomerate formation in the northwestern portion, and sandstone formation in parts of the northern portion of the township.

The elevation of the township varies from 1500 ft. above sea level, in the extreme southern portion of the township, to 3500 ft. above sea level, on the higher hills of the northeastern portion of the township. The general drainage and exposure is southerly into Lake Mead.

The soil is rocky clay and clay loam over the greater portion of the township, with gravelly clay loam over most of the less rugged portions, and rocky sandy loam in parts of the northern portion of the township. It may be classed as 3rd and 4th rate.

There is no water within the township; the nearest water being Lake Mead, an artificial lake formed by the construction of Boulder Dam. At the time of this resurvey, the north edge of the lake was within about one
