GENERAL DESCRIPTION

T. 28 S., R. 63 E., is located in the desert hills about 60 miles southeast of Las Vega, Nevada, ranging in elevation from about 3400 ft. to 4500 ft. above sea level. There is a good stand of native grass throughout the township. There is, however, a shortage of water which apparently limits the grazing of cattle to the winter months.

The mining town of Searchlight is located in secs. 34 and 35. There are several mines in the immediate vicinity and indications of minerals throughout the township.

A paved highway, U.S. No. 95, from Las Vegas and Boulder City, Nevada to Needles, California, passes through the township. There is also a graded road from Searchlight to Nipton, California.

The soil throughout the township is either sandy grawelly or rocky, with little or no humus, and supports a growth of native grasses, creosote brush, black brush and several types of cactus, including joshua, yucca, barrel cactus and the common flat leaf type known as prickly pear.

A steel tower power line from Boulder City, Nevada, passes through the township.
