79.86	<p>The corner of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, marked by the 1932 resurvey monument, an iron post, 2 ins. diam., firmly set and marked and witnessed as described in the official record.</p> <p>Land, level bench and broken mountainous. Soil, sandy, gravelly and rocky; 3rd and 4th rate. Timber, none. Undergrowth, creosote brush and cactus. Grazing, poor.</p> <hr/> <p>The point for the N. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 1 is at proportionate distance on the north boundary of the section.</p> <p>Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p> <div><div>$\frac{1}{4}$</div><div>S1</div><div>1947</div></div> <p>Raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, S. of cor.</p> <p>From this cor. the witness meander cor. of secs. 1 and 36 bears East 3.99 chs. dist.</p> <hr/> <p>From the corner of secs. 22, 23, 26 and 27.</p> <p>N.0o 34' W., bet. secs. 22 and 23.</p> <p>Over gently rolling bench land.</p> <p>33.00 Unimproved road, bears N. 30° E., and S. 30° W.</p> <p>40.30 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 22 and 23, marked by the original monument, an old mound of earth witnessed by traces of old pits E. and W. of cor</p> <p>At the corner point</p> <p>Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p> <div><div>$\frac{1}{4}$</div><div>S22 S23</div><div>1947</div></div> <p>Dig pits, 18x18x12 ins., N. and S. of post, 3 ft. dist.</p> <p>N. 1° 15' E., bet. secs. 22 and 23, beginning new measurement.</p> <p>Desc. slightly over gently rolling land.</p> <p>40.95 The corner of secs. 14, 15, 22 and 23, marked by the original monument, a granite stone, 6x12x14 ins., mkd. with 3 grooves on the south face and 2 grooves on the east face, loosely set in a mound of stone.</p> <p>At the corner point</p> <p>Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p> <div><div>T32S R66E</div><div>S15 S14</div><div>S22 S23</div><div>1947</div></div> <p>Raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, W. of cor. and bury the original marked stone at the base of the iron post.</p> <p>Land, gently rolling.</p>
