General Description

The area embraced within the four townships ( Tps. 31 and 32 N., Rs. 66 and 67 E. ) the boundaries of which are described within these field notes is located in the Goshute Valley, approximately 20 miles south of Shafter, Nevada, the nearest postoffice. On the east and the northwest the area extends into the foothills of the Toana Range on the east and the Pequop Range on the northwest. The area is covered with a moderately dense stand of desert vegetation, including, shadscale, sagebrush, greasewood and white sage, which afford fairly good winter range for livestock, when and where water is available. There is no natural year-round source of water within the townships or close thereto altho there are some wells in the vicinity.

With the exception of the small portion of the area in the foothills which have a moderate stand of juniper and pinon timber with a few fir trees in scattered locations, there is no timber.
