

Dependent Resurvey of the East  $\frac{1}{2}$  Mile of the South Boundary of  
T. 6 S., R. 61 E.

Chains

- 10.00 Spur, slopes SW.; thence asc. and desc. along S. slope.
- 21.00 Wash, 30 lks. wide, 3 ft. deep, in ravine, drains S. 20° W.; asc. 400 ft. over broken W. to NW. slopes to sec. cor.
- 40.00 The reestablished cor. of Ts. 6 and 7 S., R. 61 E., which is monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of the east boundary of T. 7 S., R. 61 E., executed concurrently under this same survey group.
- Note: This township corner is reestablished at record distances from the nearest recovered original corners to the west and to the south hereof.
- Land, mountainous.  
Soil, gravelly to rocky clay loam.  
Timber, none; undergrowth, sagebrush, greasewood, blackbrush and bunch grass.

Superseding the Survey Executed by

Note: No evidence of the original survey found along this boundary line.

Beginning at the reestablished cor. of Ts. 6 and 7 S., R. 61 E.

North, on the E. bdy. of sec. 36, T. 6 S., R. 61 E.

Over rocky and almost barren mountainous land, through very scattered timber and undergrowth; desc. 65 ft. over NW. and W. slopes to spur.

- 2.87 Point for the closing cor. of Ts. 6 and 7 S., R. 62 E., described in the field notes of the survey of the north boundary of T. 7 S., R. 62 E., executed concurrently under this same survey group.
- 10.00 Flat spur, slopes N. 30° W.; desc. 65 ft. over N. slope.
- 12.80 Small ravine, drains N. 60° W. for 1 chain, then turns to W.; thence asc. and desc. along W. slope.
- 15.40 Flat spur, slopes W.; desc. 25 ft. over NW. slope.
- 20.00 Small ravine, drains S. 80° W.; asc. 90 ft. over SW. slope.
- 30.50 Flat spur, slopes W.; asc. 85 ft. along W. slope to  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.
- 40.00 Point for the E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 36.
- Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 18 ins. in the ground to bedrock, and supported in a mound of stone, 4 ft. base, 12 ins. high, with brass cap mkd.
