

Independent Resurvey of the East Boundary of T. 6 S., R. 61 E.

Chains

No auxiliary accessory.

83.22 Point for the closing cor. of Ts. 5 and 6 S., R. 62 E., described in the field notes of the survey of the N. bdy. of T. 6 S., R. 62 E., executed concurrently under this same survey group.

86.83 Point for the cor. of Ts. 5 and 6 S., R. 61 E., which is East, on a latitudinal curve, from the original cor. of secs. 3, 4, 33 and 34, Ts. 5 and 6 S., R. 61 E., hereinafter described.

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 4 ins. in the ground to bedrock, and supported in a mound of stone, 4 ft. base, 26 ins. high, with brass cap mkd.

A juniper, 4 ins. diam., bears N. 34½° W., 137 lks. dist., mkd. S36 BT.

A juniper, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 60° W., 92 lks. dist., mkd. S1 BT.

Land, part gently rolling desert, part broken to rolling mountainous.

Soil, part sandy clay loam, part rocky.

Timber, scattered juniper and Joshua trees; undergrowth, sagebrush, greasewood, blackbrush, and bunch grass.

From the cor. of Ts. 5 and 6 S., R. 61 E., described above.

West, bet. secs. 1 and 36, Ts. 5 and 6 S., R. 61 E., on a latitudinal curve.

Over rolling to broken desert land, through scattered timber and undergrowth; desc. 55 ft. over gradual W. slope.

7.00 Shallow wash, 20 lks. wide, drains S. 10° W.; asc. 140 ft. over rolling E. slope.

18.60 Low saddle in flat ridge, forming the divide between desert valleys, bears N. and S.; desc. 235 ft. over rolling W. and NW. slopes to ¼ sec. cor.

40.00 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 10 ins. in the ground to solid rock, supported in a mound of stone, 4 ft. base, 20 ins. high, with brass cap mkd.
