Chains

No auxiliary accessory.

From this corner, the original cor. of secs. 3, 4, 33 and 34, which is monumented with an unmarked trachyte stone, 10x8x5 ins., firmly set in earth and in a flat mound of stone, bears West, 2.97 chs. dist. This corner will no longer serve for secs. of T. 5 S., R. 61 E. and is now remonumented to refer to secs. 3 and 4, T. 6 S., R. 61 E. only, as follows:

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 20 ins. in the ground, and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 10 ins. high, with brass cap mkd.

Bury the old corner stone alongside the iron post.

No auxiliary accessory.

From this corner, the original cor. of secs. 3, 4, 9 and 10, T. 6 S., R. 61 E., which is monumented with an old juniper post, 3x3x36 ins., set in old mound of earth and stone, with illegible old scribe markings on two sides, bears S. 0° 03' E., 80.45 chs. dist. I repair the old mound and set an unmarked igneous stone, 14x4x3 ins., 8 ins. in the ground, alongside the old wooden post.

Also, from the cor. of secs. 3 and 4, on the N. bdy. of T. 6 S., R. 61 E., the original ½ sec. cor. of secs. 4 and 33, Ts. 5 and 6 S., R. 61 E., which is monumented with an indistinctly mkd. trachyte stone, 12x6x2 ins., lying loose on an old mound of earth and stone, bears S. 89° 46' W., 40.15 chs. dist. I reset the old stone, 6 ins. in the ground, and repair the surrounding mound of earth and stone.

Land, mostly mountainous.

Soil, sandy to rocky clay loam.

Timber, very scattered juniper and Joshua trees; undergrowth, sagebrush, greasewood, blackbrush, and bunch grass.

General Description

The western one-half of this township, which was surveyed in 1870, is made up of gently rolling desert valley land, and lies in the heart of Pahranagat Valley, which drains to the south towards the Pahranagat Lakes. The eastern one-half of the town-ship rises up out of Pahranagat Valley and becomes very rough and mountainous in the two east tiers of sections. A rough mountainous ridge forms the eastern limit of Pahranagat Valley drainage and runs in a north-south direction along, or near the east boundary of the township throughout most of its length.

Elevations over the township vary from about 4200 feet above sea level in Pahranagat Valley at the south boundary of section 32 to about 7500 feet at the highest point in the north-south ridge along the east boundary of the township.
