Survey of the North Boundary of T. 6 S., R. 62 E.

Chains

Land, east half, mountainous; west half, rolling desert. Soil, sandy to rocky clay loam.

Timber, scattered juniper and pinon for west half mile; undergrowth, sagebrush, greasewood, blackbrush, and Mormon tea.

General Description

The greater portion of the area of this township is made up of rolling desert land which is cut by numerous dry washes draining partly to the south and partly to the east. A ridge dividing the south and east drainages crosses the township in the north-south direction from the north boundary of section 3 to the south boundary of section 35.

Elevations over the township vary from about 4800 feet above sea level on the south boundary to about 6600 feet above sea level on the north boundary.

Soil over the township varies from light colored saline sandy clay loam in the valleys to rocky and rocky clay loam in the mountainous areas.

The valleys are generally devoid of timber, but support a scattered growth of sagebrush, greasewood, blackbrush, and bunch grass, while most of the broken mountainous areas support a similar growth of undergrowth and a scattered growth of pinon and juniper timber.

Dirt roads meander through the township in a general northsouth direction. These roads are largely unimproved, or at most are merely maintained by occasional blading.

A single wire, poorly maintained, telephone line and service road cross the southeast corner of the township from the east boundary of section 25 to the south boundary of section 34.

The area is mainly valuable for winter stock grazing.
