

Dependent Resurvey of the East Boundary of T. 7 S., R. 61 E.

Raise a supporting mound of stone, 4 ft. base, 15 ins. high, around the iron post.

From this corner, the original $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36, Ts. 6 and 7 S., R. 61 E., described in the field notes of the resurvey of the E. $\frac{1}{2}$ mile of the S. bdy. of T. 6 S., R. 61 E., executed concurrently under this same survey group, bears N. $89^{\circ} 23' W.$, 40.00 chs. dist.

No auxiliary accessory.

Land, rolling mountainous.
Soil, sandy to rocky clay loam.
Timber, none; undergrowth, sagebrush, greasewood, rabbit brush, and cacti.

Survey of the East Boundary of T. 7 S., R. 62 E.

From the cor. of Ts. 6 and 7 S., Rs. 62 and 63 E., which is monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of the survey of the north boundary of T. 8 S., R. 62 E., executed concurrently under this same survey group.

North, bet. secs. 31 and 36, Ts. 7 S., Rs. 62 and 63 E.

Over very gently rolling desert valley, through scattered Joshua trees and undergrowth; desc. 40 ft. over NE. drainage to $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

40.00 Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36.

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
