

Dependent Resurvey of the First Standard Parallel South,
Along the East $\frac{1}{2}$ Mile, South Bdy. of Sec. 36, T. 4 S., R. 63 E.

Chains

Bury the old corner stone alongside the iron post, and raise a mound of stone, $3\frac{1}{2}$ ft. base, 3 ft. high, N. of cor.

From this corner, a small rocky peak, bears N. 50° W., approximately 3 chs. dist.

Thence

S. $89^\circ 57'$ E., on the First Standard Parallel South, along the S. bdy. of sec. 36, T. 4 S., R. 63 E. (East $\frac{1}{2}$ mile.)

Over gently rolling desert land, through very scattered timber and undergrowth; desc. 70 ft. over rolling SE. slope.

6.90 Small meandering wash, drains generally to S.; asc. 65 ft. over rolling SW. slope.

14.82 Point for the closing cor. of Ts. 5 S., Rs. 63 and 64 E., hereinafter described.

Thence over nearly level land, sloping slightly to N.

20.80 Change to E. slope; desc. 75 ft. over same.

36.60 Base of slope, bears N. and S.; thence over nearly level desert.

40.28 The original standard cor. of Ts. 4 S., Rs. 63 and 64 E., which is monumented with a trachyte stone, $18 \times 8 \times 5$ ins., firmly set and mkd. with 6 notches on E., W., and N. edges.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

Bury the old corner stone alongside; dig a surrounding circular trench, 8 ft. diam., 1 ft. deep, and raise a flat mound of earth around the iron post.

Land, gently rolling desert valley.

Soil, light sandy clay loam.

Timber, very scattered juniper and pinon; undergrowth, sagebrush, greasewood, blackbrush, and bunch grass.

Survey of the West Boundary of T. 5 S., R. 63 E.

Beginning at the cor. of Ts. 5 and 6 S., Rs. 62 and 63 E., which is monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of the survey of the E. bdy. of T. 6 S., R. 62 E., executed concurrently under this same survey group.

North, bet. secs. 31 and 36, Ts. 5 S., Rs. 62 and 63 E.

Over broken mountainous land, through scattered timber and undergrowth; asc. 135 ft. over SE. slope.
