Raise an auxiliary mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, N. of cor.

From this corner, the point for the original cor. of Ts. 8 S., Rs. 63 and 64 E., from which I removed the above iron post, bears N. 48° 08' W., 3.10 chs. dist. I destroy all visible evidence of the old corner position and its accessories.

Land, mountainous for east 56 chs.; nearly level desert for west 24 chs.

Soil, clay, gravel, and rock for east 56 chs.; sandy clay loam for west 24 chs.

Timber, scattered juniper for east 56 chs., none for west 24 chs.; undergrowth, sagebrush, greasewood, and cacti.

General Description

This is a typical southern Nevada desert township, the land varying from nearly level desert valley floor to broken mountainous hills and ridges.

The central portion of the township is the highest part of it, so that drainage is outward in all directions through a series of washes draining to the north, west, south, and east from the central heights.

Juniper timber is distributed quite generally over much of the area but generally in quite scattered stands. There are a few Joshua trees in various places over the area. Undergrowth consists mainly of sagebrush, greasewood, rabbit brush, bunch grass, and cacti.

There are no improved roads leading into this township and only limited access into the area through unimproved rut roads. The area is used sparingly for winter stock grazing only, as water is generally unavailable at other seasons of the year.
