General Description

T. 19 S., R. 60 E., is a nearly flat desert land with a gradual east slope; the soil is practically all gravel. There are numerous washes throughout the township, draining in a generally easterly direction and ending in alluvial fans.

U. S. Highway No. 95 traverses through the township, entering in section 35 and leaving near the middle of section 6. State Highway No. 39 enters the township just south of the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 6 and intersects U. S. Highway No. 95 in the west half of sec. 6. A black top road to Tule Spring ranch extends along the west side of secs. 9 and 16; numerous other access roads are found throughout the township.

The vegetation consists mostly of creosote brush with some buck brush, cacti, and yucca.

There is a settler in the northwest cor. of sec. 28, living in a trailer, who has made a few improvements, which include a yard fenced for goats.

There are numerous gravel placer claims staked throughout the area.
