General Description

The SE cor. of T. 20 S., R. 60 E., M.D.M., is situated on the W. boundary of the City Limits of Las Vegas, Nevada, in Clark County, Nevada. That portion of the township covered by this resurvey lies directly west of Las Vegas, and on the north side of Charleston Road which follows along the 5th Standard Parallel South.

The general elevation is about 2200 ft. above sea level, and is, at the time the resurvey was executed, practically unoccupied by permanent residents. Sections 33 and 36 contain certain areas classified for disposal under the small tract act.

The soil in the area consists of sand and gravel deposits, generally underlain with a solid layer of caliche, a limestone formation. There are several wells about 160 ft. deep located in sec. 36. No wells were found in sec. 33. No known minerals are indicated nor are there any mines of any kind. No cultivated fields were found in the area, nor is there any natural timber located therein. It is typically a desert country with the attendant climate of the desert. Owing to its proximity to Las Vegas, it is valuable for residential purposes.
