11.60	<p>Nevada State Highway No. 85, gravel surfaced, bears N. 73° E. and S. 73° W.</p>
25.60	<p>Dry wash, 150 lks. wide, 10 ft. deep, course N. 60° E.</p>

Soil, sand and gravel. Vegetation, scattered creosote bush, salt brush, and cactus.</p>
