## General Description

Township 21 South, Range 60 East is mostly gently rolling to nearly level land. Elevation varies from about 2200 ft. on the east boundary to 2800 ft. on the west boundary of the township. Drainage is afforded by a series of washes draining generally easterly.

The soil throughout the township is mostly sand and gravel, overlying large deposits of gravel and bedrock.

Vegetation throughout the township consists almost exclusively of scattered creosote bush, varieties of salt brush, and cactus, which afford very poor forage for livestock.

A number of improved roads are being used to haul gravel from pits located in this township. There are also a large number of unimproved roads which serve the area, making most of the township readily accessible by truck.

Most, if not all, of the township has been classified as suitable for small tracts, and many of these now have homes on them in the northwest portion of the township.

The mean magnetic variation throughout the area was found to be  $15^{\circ}$  45' E.
