

Dependent Resurvey of the West Boundary of T. 41 N., R. 37 E.

Chains

Land, nearly level.
Soil, clay-loam.
Vegetation, rabbitbrush, greasewood and sagebrush.
No timber.

N. 0° 05' W. bet. secs. 1 and 6.

Over nearly level land.

39.93 Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 6, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post 30 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

Bury an igneous stone, 10x6x4 ins., mkd. X, at base of iron post.

72.39 Unimproved road, bears E. and W.

79.86 The accepted corner of Ts. 41 and 42 N., Rs. 36 and 37 E., found marked by a steel pipe 30 ins. long and 1" diam., firmly set in ground with decayed remains of a wood stake, fragments of which show scribe marks, lying alongside.

At the corner point, set an iron post, 30 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
