

Dependent Resurvey of the Subdivisional Lines, T.45 N., R. 38 E

Chains

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within T. 45 N., R. 38 E. is principally nearly level with the east boundary running along the foothills of a mountain range with a western exposure and drainage generally northwest towards the Quinn River. The valley elevation is about 4500 ft. above sea level with the hills along the east boundary ranging 200 to 800 ft. higher.

There are two streams running northwest through the township. Flat Creek runs through secs. 34, 27, 28, 29, 20 and 19. Canyon Creek runs through secs. 13, 14, 11, 10, 3 and 4.

The soil is a medium sandy loam in the valley and gravelly loam in the hills, with some outcrops of rock on the higher ridges. A heavy growth of sagebrush is found throughout the township with a light growth of June grass. This is mostly spring and early summer range land.

There is an improved oil highway, U. S. 95, running northeast through secs. 5, 6, 7, 18 and 19.

There is one stock ranch in secs. 27, 28, 33 and 34, which has about 200 acres of cultivated ground.

There are no apparent mineral deposits within the township.
