GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within T. 47 N., R. 38 E. is nearly level to level, with rolling ground along the E. side of the township. The drainage is generally W. and SW. to the Quinn River which flows S. through secs. 5, 6, 8, 17, 18, 20, 29, 30, 31 and 32. Drainage of the W. mile of the township is E. to the Quinn River. The E. branch of the Quinn River flows W. through secs. 13, 14, 15, 16, 17 and SW., meeting the main Quinn River in sec. 20. The valley elevation is about 4500 ft. above sea level.

The soil is a medium sandy loam throughout the township with gravelly loam on the E and W. edges. There are some alkali areas in secs. 5, 6, 7 and 8. The E. half of the township is covered with heavy sagebrush except along the E. branch of the Quinn River in secs. 13, 14, 15 and 16. The W. half of the township has considerable rye grass, meadow land, with areas of bullberry bushes and willows along the river.

There are two abandoned reservations in the township; the McDermitt Military Reservation in secs. 1, 12, 13 and 14 which is now Indian Land, and the U.S. Hay Reservation in secs. 4 to 9 and 16 to 21. There is Indian land in secs. 6, 8, 17, 22, 23 and 24. There are numerous small Indian farms along the E. branch of the Quinn River in secs. 13, 14, and 15, and also several large stock ranches in the W. half of the township. The land is used principally for growing hay and grazing.

There is a main oil highway, U.S. 95, which runs through the township from N. to S. in secs. 5, 9, 16, 21, 28 and 33. There are two oiled roads running E. from U.S. 95, one through secs. 12, 13, 14, 15 and 16, the other through secs. 13, 21, 22 and 23.

There is no apparent mineral deposit within the township.
