## General Description

The main portion of the area resurveyed in this township is located in Steptoe Valley, which lies between the Schell range of mountains on the East and the Egan range on the W. Heusser Mountain rises to an elevation of approximately 9500 ft. and lies in a general NNW. direction, being visible from any part of the area resurveyed. The land has a gradual NNW. slope and ranges in elevation from approximately 6250 ft. in the southern portion to 6100 ft. in the northeastern portion. The soil, for the most part, is sandy and gravelly loam, with sandy clay loam in the north central portion.

An oiled highway, U. S. Nos. 50 and 93, traverses through the southeast portion of the area resurveyed, entering the township near the corner of sections 1, 2, 35 and 36 on the south boundary and leaving near the NE 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 25 and 30 on the east boundary. Telephone lines located adjacent to U. S. Highway Nos. 50 and 93 also traverse through the area resurveyed. There is a graded gravelled road traversing across the southeast portion of sec. 36, entering the township near the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36 on the south boundary, thence in a general northeast direction, leaving near the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36 on the east boundary.

Yelland Airport is located in the western portion of secs. 25 and 36 and the eastern portion of secs. 26 and 35.

Vegetation consists mostly of scattered sagebrush, although there is some growth of native grasses over the entire area, with a heavy growth along small washes where the moisture is sufficient to
