

Survey of Subdivision of Section Lines, T. 20 S., R. 59 E.

Chains

Land; gently rolling desert valley.
Soil; sandy to gravelly clay loam.
Timber; none. Undergrowth, scattered yucca and creosote brush.

From the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 7 and 12 on the E. bdy. of the township, which is monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set, marked and witnessed as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of a portion of T. 20 S., R. 60 E., executed concurrently but under Group 357.

S. $88^{\circ} 48'$ W., on the E. and W. center line of sec. 12.

Asc. very slightly over gradual NE. and N. slopes, through scattered yucca and creosote brush.

20.96 Point for the center E. $\frac{1}{16}$ sec. cor. of sec. 12.

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 18 ins. in the ground, and in a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 12 ins. high, with brass cap mkd.

53.55 Wash, 1 ch. wide, 4 ft. deep, drains NE.

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 14 ins. in the ground, and in a mound of stone, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ft. base, 16 ins. high, with brass cap mkd.

75.50 Leave gently rolling floor of desert valley; asc. 265 ft. over E. slope.

83.88 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 11 and 12.

Land; gently rolling desert valley for E. 75.50 chs., remainder mountainous.

Soil; sandy to gravelly clay loam.

Timber; none. Undergrowth; yucca and creosote brush.

General Description

Most of the area of secs. 1 and 12 is made up of gently rolling desert valley land, cut by numerous wide, deep washes. However, an isolated hill covering about 100 acres is situated on the E. bdy. of sec. 1. This hill reaches an elevation of about 625 ft. above the surrounding desert valley, and slopes quite steeply in all directions from its highest point down to the desert valley floor. The W. line of sec. 12 lies along or near the E. foot of steep desert hills.
