

Dependent Resurvey of the East Boundary of T. 13 S., R. 47 E.

The original closing cor. of Ts. 13 S., Rs. 47 and 48 E., which is mkd. by an iron post, 3 ins. diam., firmly set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record. This closing cor. now functions for NE. cor. of sec. 1, T. 13 S., R. 47 E. only. I alter the markings on the brass cap to read

I repair and enlarge the auxiliary mound of stone.

From this cor. the standard cor. T. 12 S., Rs. 47 and 48 E., bears N. 89° 47' E., 12.72 chs. dist.

Land, broken mountainous.

Soil, sandy, gravelly, and rocky.

Timber, none; undergrowth, creosote bush.

General Description

The general elevation of this township ranges from approximately 2700 feet above sea level in the southern portion to 2900 feet in the north-central portion, and 3600 feet in the northeastern portion.

The eastern tier of sections is rough mountainous land and the remainder of the township varies from gently rolling in the west and northern portions to nearly level. The soil is a fine sandy texture and volcanic ash. The township is covered with a fairly heavy growth of creosote bush with a sparse growth of native grasses.

There are no flowing streams in the township. The Amargosa River, dry, enters the township from the north near the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 6 and 31, flows in a general south-southeast direction, and leaves the township near the cor. of Ts. 13 S., Rs. 46 and 47 E.

An oiled road, U. S. Highway No. 95, enters the township from the east near the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 36, traverses in a general north-west direction, and leaves the township near the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 5 and 32 on the north boundary.

The old Tonopah and Tidewater Railroad grade, which has been dismantled, enters the township from the south near the cor. of secs. 34 and 35, traverses in a general northwest direction, and leaves the township near the cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31, and 32 on the north boundary.

There are no settlers living within the township.
