Chains

General Description

The general elevation of this township ranges from approximately 2540 feet above sea level in the southwest portion to 3000 feet in the northwest and north-central portions, and from 3100 feet in the northeast portion to 3330 feet in the southeast portion of the township.

The southwest and north-central portions of the township are nearly level to gently rolling land. Yucca Mountain is located in the eastern one-third of the township and it is heavily rolling to rough mountainous land. The central and part of the northwest portions of the township are also heavily rolling to rough mountainous land. An area known as Crater Flat is located in the north-central portion of the township.

The soil is a fine sandy texture and volcanic ash. The township is covered with a fairly heavy growth of greasewood and creosote bush with a sparse growth of native grasses.

There are no flowing streams in the township.

An oiled road, U. S. Highway No. 95, enters the township from the southeast near the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 3 and 34, traverses in a general northwest direction, and leaves the township near the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 19 and 24 on the west boundary. There is also an access road in the northern portion of the township.

There is a gravel and/or cinder pit located in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 36, and another gravel pit is located in the north-central portion of sec. 34.

There are no settlers living within the township and none of the land has been brought under cultivation.
