

Independent Resurvey of the North Boundary of T. 14 S., R. 49 E.

Chains

Land, nearly level to rolling.
Soil, sandy and gravelly loam.
Timber, none; undergrowth, creosote bush.

S. 89° 59' W., bet. secs. 6 and 31.

Over rolling land, through scattered undergrowth. Continue ascent; asc. 145 ft. over E. slope.

10.00 Top of ridge, bears NNE. and SSW.; desc. 23 ft. over gradual WSW. slope.

22.00 Continue descent; desc. 214 ft. over steep W. slope.

40.00 Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 6 and 31.

Set an iron post, 36 ins. long, 1 in. diam., 8 ins. in the ground to solid rock, and in a mound of stone to top, with brass cap mkd.

42.30 Begin descent; desc. 321 ft. over steep W. slope.

62.93 The cor. of Ts. 13 and 14 S., Rs. 48 and 49 E., which is mkd. by an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of the independent resurvey of the east boundary of T. 14 S., R. 48 E., executed concurrently under this same group.

Land, rolling mountainous.
Soil, sandy and gravelly loam.
Timber, none; undergrowth, creosote bush.

General Description

The general elevation of this township ranges from approximately 2580 feet above sea level in the southern portion to approximately 3300 feet in the northern portion. Approximately 40 per cent of the land in the township is nearly level, and the remaining 60 per cent is gently rolling to rolling mountainous land.

The soil is a fine sandy and gravelly texture. The township is covered with a fairly heavy growth of creosote bush with a sparse growth of native grasses. There are no flowing streams in the township.

There are no improved roads in the township at the present time. There is one access road, ungraded, through the northern portion of the township.

There are no settlers living within the township and none of the land has been brought under cultivation.
