GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within the portion of Township 44 North, Range 34 East, which was dependently resurveyed, is level to nearly level, except the East tier of sections, which are rough hills bearing North and South. The drainage is South, the main channel being the Kings River, which is a small stream, that meanders South through the center of township. The elevation in the valley is about 4200 ft. above sea level.

The soil is a medium sandy loam, with a heavy growth of sagebrush, except the hills which are rocks and ledges.

There is a county road, which bears Southerly along the East boundary of secs. 3 and 10, to intersection with ranch road which bears East near South boundary of secs. 7, 8, 9, and 10; thence the main road bears Easterly, and a secondary road bears Southerly.

A small ranch is located in the NW. $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 14, with considerable homestead enteries in NW. portion of tp. The over all use of the land is for grazing.

There are no apparent mineral deposits within the township.
