

Dependent Resurvey of Portion of Subdivision of T. 45 N., R. 34 E.

Chains

77.11 The cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12, on the W. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with an iron post, set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of T. 45 N., R. 33 E., surveyed concurrently under this same group.

Land, level.
Soil, sandy loam.
Timber, none.
Undergrowth, thick sagebrush.

From the cor. of secs. 5, 6, 7 and 8.

N. 1° 23' E., bet. secs. 5 and 6.

Over nearly level land, through thick sagebrush.

1.96 Improved gravel road, bears N. 40° W. and S. 40° E.

40.75 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 5 and 6, at proportionate dist.; there is no remaining evidence of the original cor.

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

82.18 The closing cor. of secs. 5 and 6, on the N. bdy. of the Tp., mkd. by an iron post, 3 ins. diam., firmly set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record of the 1923 survey of the Ninth Standard Parallel North.

From this closing cor. the standard $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 32, T. 46 N., R. 34 E., monumented with an iron post, set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record, bears W. 2.28 chs. dist.

General Description

The land within the portion of T. 45 N., R. 34 E. which was dependently resurveyed is level to nearly level except the east portion of the surveyed land, which is rough, rocky west side hills with a gradual west slope near the base. The drainage in the valley is southerly and westerly from the hills. The extreme differences in elevation are about 4,300 feet in the valley to 5,700 feet in the hills, above sea level.

The soil is a medium sandy loam in the valley and rough and rocky in the hills. The vegetation in the valley is thick sagebrush, meadow and clearings for homesteads. In the hills there is scattered sagebrush and grass.

There is one main road that enters the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of section 6 and leaves the township through the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of section 34, with several secondary roads entering this main road, both from the east and the west.

A small ranch is located in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of section 21 with a considerable number of homestead entries along the boundary. The overall use of the land is for grazing.

There is one mine, known as the Moonlight, which bears N. 10° W., 13.64 chs. from the S $\frac{1}{4}$ corner of section 9.
