Timber, none.
Undergrowth, creosote bush, catclaw acacia, and opuntia cholla.

Independent Resurvey of a Portion of the North Boundary of T. 25 S., R. 64 E., and a Portion of the South Boundary of T. 24 S., R. 65 E.
(Sixth Standard Parallel South)

Superseding the survey executed by T. A. Magee in 1882.
From the standard cor. of T. 24 S., Rs. 64 and 65 E., established in 1931, which is marked with an iron post, 3 ins. diam., firmly set in the ground, marked and witnessed as defined in the 1931 independent resurvey record.

East, on the true line, on the S. bdy. of sec. 31, T. 24 S., R. 65 E.

Over broken mountainous land, through scattered undergrowth.

.66 Point for the 1/16 sec. cor. of sec. 1, only, established 80.00 chs. E. of the closing cor. of secs. 1 and 2, T. 25 S., R. 64 E.

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 8 ins. in the ground, to solid rock, and in a mound of stone to top, with brass cap mkd.

When the independent resurvey cor. of Tps. 25 and 26 S., Rs. 63 and 64 E., was established in 1941 with an iron post monument, the original cor. stone for the cor. of Tps. 25 and 26 S., Rs. 63 and 64 E. was recovered. A direct tie was made to this original cor.
