General Description	
<p>Township 26 South, Range 62 East, is located South-South-West of a large valley which is named the Eldorado Valley. The general elevation of the township ranges from about 2,100 feet above sea level in the northern portion to about 3,200 feet above sea level in the central and southern portion.</p> <p>The eastern one-third of the township is nearly level and gently rolling land; the central portion is rough, broken mountainous land; and the western portion is gently rolling to nearly level land. The soil is sandy and gravelly; and the larger portion of the township is covered with fairly large stones. There are no springs or streams in the township. There is no timber in the township, and the vegetation consists of cactus, yucca, and creosote bush; with sparse grass along most of the large washes.</p> <p>The Southern California Edison Company have two power lines and an improved oil surfaced road, that enters the township from the north-east near the cor. of sections 3, 4, 33, and 34, on the north bdy. of the township, traverses in a general south-south-west direction through sections 4, 9, 8, 17, 20, 29, 32, and 31, and leaves the township near the cor. of sections 31 and 32, on the south bdy. of the township. There are no other developments or settlers in the township.</p>
