The south two miles of the east boundary of T. 18 S., R. 66 E. cross over rolling to broken desert land in the east portion of White Basin. The east boundaries of sections 24, 13 and 12 cross over broken mountain desert land of the Muddy Mountain Range, and the east boundary of section 1 extends into the Valley of Fire.

The vegetation along this line consists mainly of very scattered black brush, creosote bushes and bunch grass.

The soil is shallow gravel and rocky, with irregular limestone formations at the higher elevations of the Muddy Mountains. The soil of the portion which extends into the Valley of Fire is sandy gravel with exposed sandstone formations.

The northeast corner of this township can be reached by the Arrowhead Trail Road which bears through the north portion of the township. The southeast corner can be reached by bulldozed spurs which branch off the American Borax Road and lead to numerous claims of the St. Thomas Mining District which lies partially within the southeast portion of the township.

There was no water noted along this line.
