General Description	
<p>The region crossed by the south boundary of T. 19 S., R. 66 E. through the east two miles consists of broken and irregular red sandstone formations in the Bowl of Fire. The west four miles are broken desert land in Bitter Spring Valley. The south four miles of the east boundary cross over broken desert land in Bitter Spring Valley. The north two miles of the east boundary cross over a spur of the Muddy Mountains, and the northeast township corner falls in the southeast portion of White Basin. The north boundary of the township crosses rolling desert land of White Basin, with the exception of one high spur along the east $\frac{1}{2}$ mile of the north boundary of sec. 2.</p> <p>The drainage and exposure of the township is generally east to Echo Wash.</p> <p>The vegetation consists mainly of scattered black brush, cresote bush and bunch grass. There is no timber in the vicinity.</p> <p>The American Borax Road enters the township on the north boundary of sec. 1, leading to the American Borax Mines, and patented claims located within secs. 1 and 2. These mines are not in operation.</p> <p>No water was noted along these boundaries.</p>
