General Description

The land within the Township 38 North, Range 32 East, which was dependently resurveyed, is level to nearly level except the west four miles of the north boundary of the township, which is on a gradual south slope, a nearly circular hill about one mile in diameter with center near the southwest corner of section 25, and the southeast corner of section 36 is on the north slope of a small hill. The general drainage is a southeast direction. The elevation in the valley is about 4,000 feet above sea level.

The soil is loam in the valley, and a rocky gravelly loam in the hills, with a medium growth of sagebrush, shadscale and greasewood.

There is an improved county road which extends north along the west boundary of sections 33 and 28 to the west quarter corner of section 28; thence N. 28° W. to a point near the sotthwest corner of section 6, where it leaves the township. Another county road forks off the above mentioned road near a point one quarter of a mile west from the southeast corner of section 20 and extends north a mile and a quarter; thence about N. 46° E. to a point near the north quarter corner of section 2 where it leaves the township. A small ranch covers the major portion of the west half of section 21, the east half of section 20, the southwest quarter of section 16, and the southeast quarter of section 17, with old homesteads in sections 21, 22, 27 and 28. New homestead entries are scattered all over the township. The over-all use of the land is for grazing.

There are no apparent mineral deposits within the township.
