GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Land within T. 26 N., R. 42 E. is composed of steep hills, except the south and east boundaries and sections 25, 26, 34, 35 and 36, which land is nearly level. The general drainage is in a northeasterly direction, both on the nearly level ground and in the hills. The main drainage is Cane Creek, which enters the township near the southwest corner of section 34 and leaves near the northeast corner of section 25; and Reese River, which enters the township nearly 24 chains from the southeast corner of section 36 and leaves near the east ½ section corner of section 25:

The elevation varies from 4,900 feet on the flats to 6,577 feet above sea level at the highest peak.

The soil is loam in the valley and a rocky, gravelly loam in the hills, with medium growth of sagebrush and shadscale and a few scattered greasewood and junipers.

There is an improved country road which enters the township near the southwest corner of section 35 and extends nearly to the south $\frac{1}{4}$ section corner of section 24; thence nearly to the northeast corner of section 24; thence northerly along the east boundary of the township.

There are homestead entries on the nearly level land, but no improvements.

There are no apparent mineral deposits within the township.
